Our School Board, with input from the Director, the staff and our families, sets a school schedule that reflects both our commitment to student excellence and growth, as well as fostering community and supporting healthy, happy families, administration, staff, and teachers. We try to keep our schedule similar to the Scappoose School District in regards to start and end dates, to help facilitate families who have students in multiple schools. We have also added more hours for professional development for teachers and staff this year. Our commitment to retaining inspired and successful teachers who are expanding their knowledge and abilities within their field will strengthen our community and greatly benefit our students. Professional Development, the continuing education of faculty, staff and community partners, is an important component of healthy and thriving Place-based Education. Continuing education in Place-based programs reach far beyond implementing a new curriculum, or adopting that new textbook. It involves forging relationships, listening and understanding what the local community needs are, and providing programs and resources for youth to be engaged. Professional development creates a "Community of Practice" which opens doors to new insights, tools, people, and places for students to contribute to the community while meeting the educational needs of school. When Place-based Education is well implemented, the boundary between schools and communities becomes permeable, and students and community members benefit from the partnerships they forge. Our calendar far exceeds the required number of educational hours for K-8, allows for important professional development and community building, and gives families an opportunity for an off season long weekend to travel or spend time together.
